The Younger's weighed in 8.05 lbs. the first day and 9.60 lbs. on the second day trolling out of the front of the boat at .9 to 1.2 mph.

The weight was good enough to win the Adult-Youth category.

The first day they fished about a foot too deep so adjusted the depth for the second day. Their strategy was to fish in 5 to 7.7 feet of water with lure about 2 feet under the water.

Both their lines were rigged with a Slider grub.

Dad Younger said the lure color choice was orange and black with 32nd oz. jig head.



Younger said, "Fishing with my kid is the most enjoyable thing I could do. He loves to fish more than anything else. No matter if we win or lose we always win because it's something we can do together."

My favorite colors to use in all of these worms are Watermelon Pepper, Pumpkin Pepper, Tequila Sunrise, Motor Oil/Root Beer, and June Bug. Depending on the light conditions, and the type of forage that are in the waters you're on, one of these 5 colors is almost guaranteed to work to help you have a great day with your ultralight fishing gear!"



TIPS: The Weedless Crappie Slider

"IN HIS OWN WORDS" - The Late CHARLIE BREWER, SR.

First, before getting into the Whys and Hows of crappie fishing, and so you will better appreciate the original Weedless Crappie Slider, let me give you a little history on its development.

After fifty years of avid bass fishing I decided to learn the art of crappie fishing. I found this to be a challenge. I also discovered crappie fishing greatly improved my bass fishing- especially on lunker bass.

The visible hides and the sunken or hidden hides on the deeper channel drops, which are necessary for year-round crappie fishing, also held big bass.

As a result, many of my trophy bass have been taken from these crappie hot-spots. So... if you are an avid bassman and care nothing

about crappie it will pay you to learn something about the habits of crappie. Knowing crappie habits will definitely put more big bass on your stringer.

When fishing these structures for bass only fish the larger worm rigs, snagless bass jigs and other similar bass lures.

Also, while fishing small jigs for crappie, it is nothing unusual to pick-up bass and other fish with the same little jigs. In other words, crappie and other fish often occupy the same structures.

On my very first crappie fishing with jigs, my buddy and I were very pleased with our catch but did not like the nuisance and aggravation of hanging-up.
